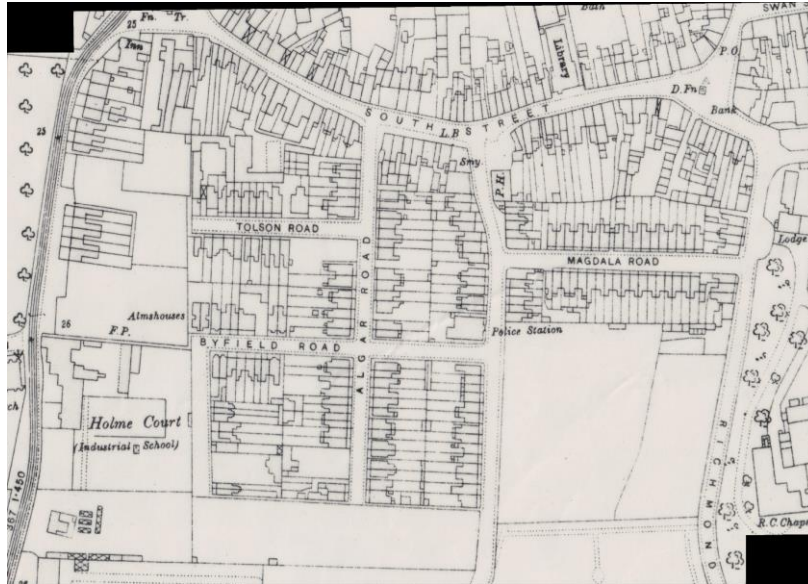


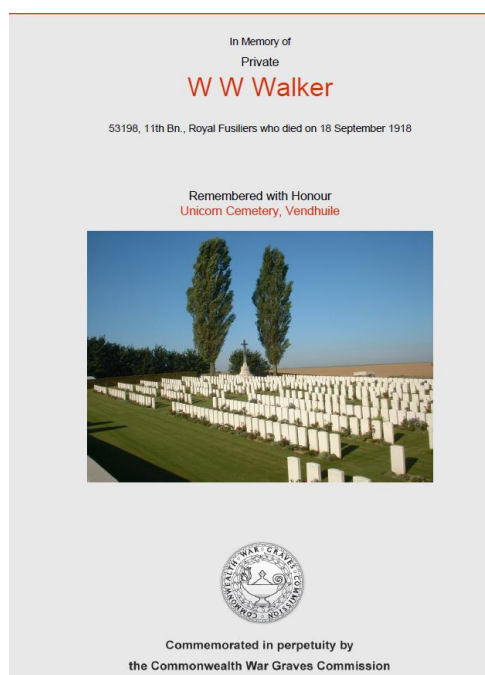
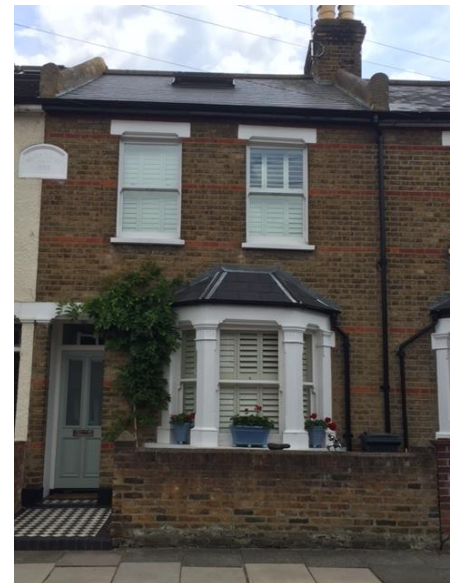
William Walter Walker

the son of Mary and Robert Walker, a market garden carter was born in Isleworth in 1891 and lived with his parents in 2 Clarendon Cottages, Byfield Road, Isleworth and at 102 Worple Road, Isleworth in 1911, where he was recorded as a market garden labourer. His sister, Annie, born 1885 was working as a domestic cook in 1901. On the 1911 census, his parents are recorded as having 5 children, with only one surviving.

He enlisted in Norwood on 28th August 1915, when he was living at 51 Bradford Road, Sydenham, with the occupation of a butcher. Private Walker (53198) served initially with the Army Service Corps then with the 11th Battalion, City of London Regiment, Royal Fusiliers and was killed in action, aged 17, in France and Flanders on 18th September 1918. He is buried in the Unicorn Cemetery, Vendhuile, France. He is also remembered on the memorial at All Souls Church, Northcote road, St Margarets.
