

Albert Newsham was born in December 1893 in Brentford. He lived with his grandparents William and Lizzie at 2 Field Lane, Brentford End, Brentford. By 1911 he was working as a dock labourer, a crane boy aged 17 and the following September he married Alice Lang and baby Arthur Edward followed in September 1913. Albert had 2 sisters, Edith who assisted Lizzie as a laundress working from home and Daisy who was a shirt machinist in a laundry. His brother Arthur Edward (1889) was a skin dresser in a skin factory.





Albert's mother, Emma Louisa, married Philip Sturt in Brentford in March 1905 and moved to 47 Newlyn Road, Tottenham where she had 2 more sons, Philip and Edward.

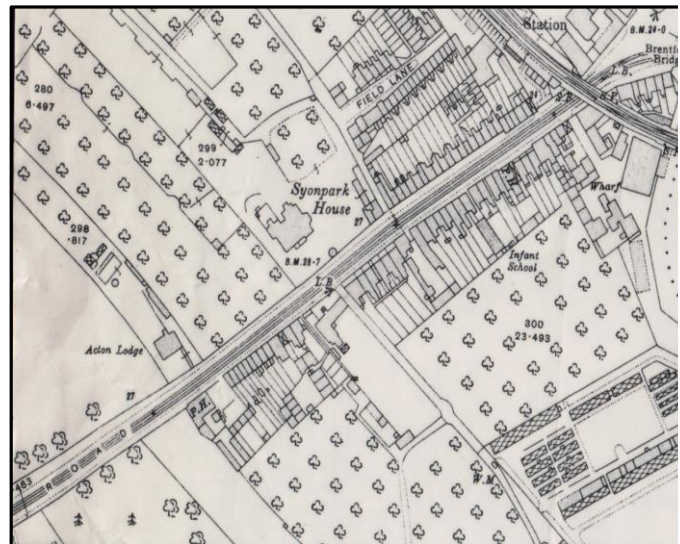

Albert enlisted into the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry "D" Company 8th Battalion as private 15281 and saw active service in Greece. He was killed in action in Salonica on 4th September 1917, aged 24. He is buried in Doiran Military Cemetery in Greece. His probate report left £202 10s to his executrices, mother Emma Sturt and grandmother, Lizzie Newsham. Albert is also

remembered in All Saints Church, Church Street, Isleworth.
