

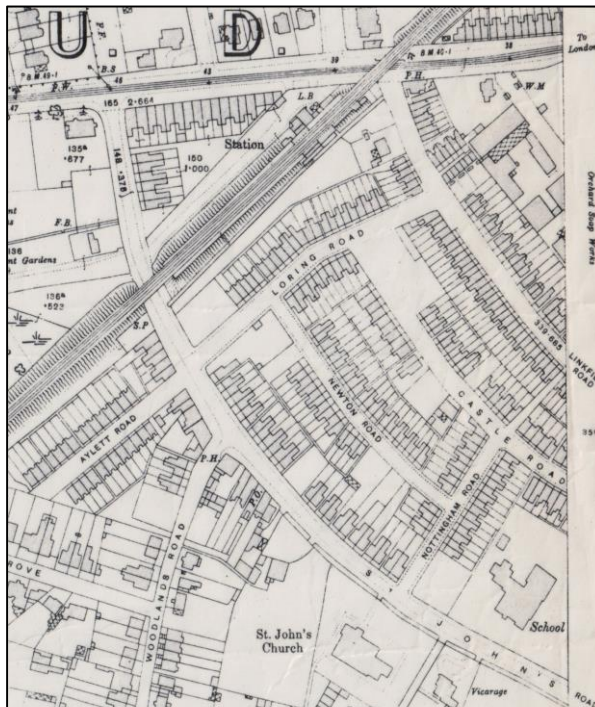
**Aubrey Plastow**, the son of Joseph Plastow, a tramway's porter and ironmonger's porter of Richmond, Surrey and Caroline, also of Richmond, was born in Richmond in 1882. He had one brother and five sisters. The family lived in 1891 in

No 1 Pomona Villas, Evelyn Road, Richmond. Reginald (1879) was a clerk to a brewery and in the 1901 census lived at 4 Selwyn Avenue, Richmond with Aubrey aged 19, a greengrocer's assistant; Dorothy (1886), an upholstress; her twin sister Winifred; Daisy Louise (1888) and Gladys Lillian Mabel (1897).



By 1911 Aubrey had moved to 23 St John's Road, Isleworth. He was single and at 29 years of age was a fruiterer and greengrocer. The rest of his sisters were still in 4 Selwyn Avenue Richmond excepting Dorothy who was living at 2A Kew Foot Road, Richmond working as a carpet sewer and living with Alfred and Margaret Jarrett who were carpet planners. Daisy was listed as a florist.

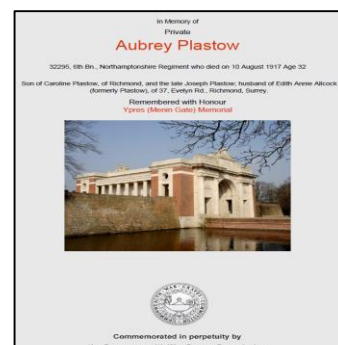
In September 1912 Aubrey married Edith Annie Voysey in Brentford. He enlisted in Hounslow into the Essex Regiment (30467) and then moved into the 6<sup>th</sup> Battalion Northamptonshire regiment as Private 32295. He was killed in action on 10<sup>th</sup> August 1917 during the capture of Westhoek, and is listed on the Menin Gate at Ypres (panel 43 and 45) and on the All Souls monument in, Northcote Road.
