

Charles George Worrell



George Charles was born in 1893 and baptised on 13th September 1893 at All Saints, Isleworth. His parents were John H Worrell (working as a bricklayer labourer in 1901) and Agnes Worrell, nee Wilson (and working as a charwoman in 1911). They married in the Brentford area in 1890. Charles had seven siblings. John born 1892 (and working as a pastry cook assistant in 1911), Willie Ernest (1899-1913), Gertrude born 1901, Margaret born 1902, Frederick born 1904, married and an assistant track lineman, working for Southern Railway in 1939 and living at 120 London Road, Isleworth, Beaty born 1907 and Albert Edward

born in May 1910, living with his wife Annie in Hounslow and working in a brewery in 1939. In 1901 the family lived in Winkworth Cottages, 8 Linkfield Road, Isleworth, in 1903, they'd moved to 180 Linkfield Road and by 1911, at 21 Mill Plat Avenue, Isleworth.

Charles's father, John, died in 1910 and by 1911, Charles was working as a live-in manservant at Clyde House, in The Grove, Spring Grove, Isleworth. His mother married James Dowse in 1913. We don't know when Charles enlisted as his service documents have not survived. He was posted to the 35th Battery, 22nd Brigade of the Royal Field Artillery as a Gunner (122586), and was killed in action on 5th October 1917 during the Third Battle of Ypres. . His name is inscribed on the Tyne Cot Memorial in Zonnebeke, Belgium. He received the Victory and British Medals. His older brother John Henry died from influenza and pneumonia in 1918. He had enlisted in

1915, but was discharged in 1916, because of his curvature of the spine and indented left chest. His mother was at his bedside when he died and he is also listed on the Isleworth Memorial. On the Isleworth Memorial, both brothers' names are inscribed as Worrall.
